#### **STATE PROJECT AND COMMITTEE DONATION PAYMENTS**

In order for your club to receive the proper credit for supporting our Lions State Projects and State and District Committees it is **IMPORTANT** that the following procedures be adhered to when making donation payments.

1. Send **ALL** project and committee payments to **District 25-G Cabinet Secretary Treasurer PDG Ann Haffner, 11268 N. State Road 13, Syracuse, IN 46567.**
2. Write one check payable to **District 25-G** for the combination of all state project and committee payments and include a list of those projects and committees you are supporting with the dollar amount for each. Do not send checks directly to State Projects, or State Committees.

**Example:** CHECK IS WRITTEN FOR \$1,100

INCLUDED LIST FOR THE EXAMPLE MIGHT READ:

\$200 for School for the Blind	\$200 for Eye Bank
\$200 for Speech and Hearing	\$200 for Leader Dog
\$100 for Sight Conservation	\$200 for Cancer Control

Periodically, as District 25-G Cabinet Secretary Treasurer, I will mail checks to each of the five state projects and to State Comptroller Lion Ron Hinshaw for committee donations for the money received. My submissions will show the dollar amount your club is to receive credit for in each state project and committee along with the name and address of the Lion in your club to receive acknowledgement. If you wish your club's donations to remain in the district for such committees as Diabetes or Law Camp please specify that with your submittal. Sight Conservation and Photoscreening donations remain in the district account until authorized by the District Committee Chairperson for expenses.

Indiana Lions for the Indiana School for the Blind and Visually Impaired, Inc. is now our 5<sup>th</sup> State Project, approved by the delegates at the Indianapolis State Convention in April, 2007.

If these procedures are followed everything will be made easier for all and the state and district will have a more accurate record of what clubs are giving to the state projects and state and district committees. ## INVESTEE vs. INVESTOR

In the last issue we spoke of the investments that you make in your life. What are the investments you made in you? For those of you with children, do you remember the feelings when the first was born? When mine were born the father waited in the waiting room with little if anything to do. Then the nurse comes, and says Mr. you have a girl or boy. My first was a girl and I wanted to see her NOW.

The investment in the child now begins in earnest, food, clothes, medical checkups, dental work, schools, college and more. As your parents invested in you, you have invested in your child. That investment went beyond the immediate family, it included the community. I believe a few years back this was more of a fact than it is now.

It has not stopped. If you are still employed, the employer is investing in you. "O yes" the employer expects a return on that investment, just as all employers before him expected a return. The expected return is different, but a return none the less.

Another body of investors in you and those like you are teachers. Most of us can think back to a special person/teacher that influenced you as a youth and that influence is still present. Then there is the person that asked you to become a Lion. Many times the reason you were asked was not consistent with the reason you accepted. They may have just wanted another body to count, someone to aid in a certain task, to assist in a new task, whatever the reason someone took the time and effort to ask. You are reading this, so we know someone trained you for other tasks, taught you about Lions, what they stand for, what the motto is, what the purpose is and about the history of your club and Lions International. None of this came to you out of the blue.

Under, around, above and in all of this is GOD. Most, if not all have heard if not read John 3:16, "For God so loved the world that he gave his only begotten son, that whoever believes in him should not perish, but have everlasting life". Can there be any greater investment? To complete the task that God sent his son to do, he had to teach and prepare the disciples to not only follow him but to be ready to teach and preach, Jesus investment. This meeting was held in Culver as we were still renovating to railroad station. There were 205 Lions and 33 of 65 clubs in attendance.

Lions giving reports were, Elmer Hahn, Al Isdepski, Frank Bogan, Dick Spicer and Kenneth Swanson. All of the Lions that gave reports are deceased and many of you do not remember those Lions. It took less than 21 years to lose track of what those Lions did. They all served our clubs and District 25-G well.

Membership (you knew I would get to membership) has dropped from 65 clubs to 58 clubs and over 900 members in 25 G in 20 years. If we continue at this rate who will continue the Eye Glass Missions, Cancer Control, the Indiana Lions Eye & Tissue Transplant Bank, Speech and Hearing, Leader Dog and the Indiana School for the Blind and Visually Impaired? Now who will take over all of the local programs the Lions have?

Membership is a state of mind and Membership is necessary for the future of your club. If you do not have a membership plan you are helping **KILL YOUR CLUB**. Is this how you want to impress your survivors?

Membership should be your club's highest priority. Membership can be fun and it will be if you have the attitude that your club's survival is important. When you have new members you have more help, more ideas and more leadership for the future.

In recognition of his contributions, he has received numerous awards, including the 100% Club President Award, the 100% District Governor Award, 15 International President's Awards and the Ambassador of Good Will Award, the highest award the association grants to its members. He is also a Progressive Melvin Jones Fellow.

In addition to his Lions activities, he has served as a Little League volunteer and as a Eucharistic minister. He is a former member of the board of directors of the United Nations Association of the USA.

International President Brandel's wife, Dr. Maureen Murphy, an anesthesiologist and a Lion, practices at a community hospital.
