## District 25 G Cabinet Meeting Minutes

The first cabinet meeting of the 2004-2005 year was held on August 7, 2004 at Lakeville Elementary School. There were 22 clubs represented.

The meeting was called to order at 12:00 noon by DG Buddy Mancha. Pledge to the flag was led by VDG Nelson Nix. Song leader PDG Gene Downhour led in a verse of America. The Invocation was given by DG Buddy Mancha. Dinner was served.

After a thank you to the cooks, DG Buddy introduced the new cabinet. Roll call of the clubs was called by Cabinet Secretary Deborah Mancha. There were 49 members and 8 guests present.

A call for approval of the May minutes was made. PDG Gene Downhour made the motion and PDG Dave Court seconded, all approved.

Cabinet Treasurer PDG Jeri Seely reported that half of the clubs had already paid their dues. The financial report was presented. A motion to accept was made by Sergeant at Arms Jerry Wright and seconded by PDG Ann Haffner. Motion approved.

DG Buddy presented the proposed budget for 2004-2005. After brief discussion a motion to approve was made, seconded and given unanimous approval.

The Cabinet Secretary presented the Governors Attendance award to Syracuse, for having the most members in attendance. A drawing among club secretaries present was held. PDG Jeri Seely was first drawn and presented a set of candles. PDG Bob Meyers was drawn second and took home a wood eyeglass collection box for his club. A brief announcement regarding District Directories and pin sales was made, followed by a request for corrections to be emailed to the cabinet secretary if errors were found.

Donna Varner introduced her guests from Youth Exchange, who were asked to address the meeting. Yuske gave a short talk about his visit so far and told us a little about his home town and family. Jungi talked about some of the cultural differences; noting that he is glad to be here but is finding it hard to adjust to the fact that Americans use so many words when we talk. Both young men were heartily welcomed.

Welcome to the Guests was given by DG Buddy, followed by a call for reports.

- PDG Dave Court reported on Speech and Hearing's alternative communication project; Noting that Riley Children's Hospital is applauding the Lions for this Project.
- PDG Ann Haffner reported on the LCIF grant for the tornado disaster in Peru. A \$10,000 grant was received and distributions were made to the Peru area victims. PDG Ann also reported on Cancer Control. There are \$50,000 dollars remaining on the Gamma knife. The final check will be presented at the state convention. They are now looking for a new project. Information on memorial donations was presented. Pins and Knives are available for sale. The trustees meeting in September will include presentations by various doctors and there will be a presentation by patient Danielle Cottner. Thanks to all clubs who have done fundraisers for cancer control.
- PDG Charlie Haffner reported that there has been \$850 given for 50 sets of white canes to be used for photoscreening fundraisers. Money is also available for stickers to clubs who return the report on their white cane days. There are available 1<sup>st</sup> come 1<sup>st</sup> serve for white cane day projects.
- Art Birk reported that District 25 G had finished +37 in membership. He also reported on EYE Bank. Indiana is one of the top 10 in the country. There are many challenges for the Eye Bank. The cost is going up to process corneas, as well as an increase in cost for the transplant. Donations to the Eye Bank by Lions are dropping. PDG Art pointed out that in North America patients do not have to wait for a transplant, but this is not true in other countries. There is still a world wide need and money is needed to continue providing services. Congratulations were offered for the help 25G provides.
- Don Gilpin thanked everyone for their response to his email regarding the need for help for a girl in South Bend,
- Pat Birk gave a reminder on Liberty Day. Copies of the constitution are available to hand out to schools. See her regarding Liberty Day and Peace Poster.
- DG Buddy introduced a special display given by International, which clubs can borrow to advertise Lionism at special events. He followed with comments of the international convention in Detroit.
- VDG Nelson Nix pointed out how easy it is for projects to "get lost" in our thoughts until the need for them hits home. His son has just had a 3"x5" melanoma removed from his back. VDG Nix shared his experiences. He called Dottie Flack and got his son connected to IU. He will be seen there Monday. Cancer Control needs our support.
- PDG Bud Seely gave the Indiana Trust Fund report. They need help at the state fair. There are 14000 plus Lions in the State and only 600 Lion License plates to support the fund. WHERE IS YOUR PLATE?
- CS Deborah presented a project for recycling used ink cartridges from inkjet and laser printers, and reminded everyone to register for banner night.
- Martin Van Meter invited everyone to the September 11<sup>th</sup> festival at Grass Creek.
- William Peckham announced that this is the last year he will be able to serve as Law Camp Chairperson.
- PID Jim Cameron reminded everyone about the Golf Outing on October 5<sup>th</sup>.
- Stan Walters and ZC Dave Eisen filled in as tail twisters.
- Jean Rakich held the 50-50 drawing. \$90 went to Elsie Downhour.
- Bev Reid announced that ZC Don was in the hospital.
- Sergeant at Arms Jerry Wright motioned to adjourn. William Peckham seconded. All were in favor. Meeting Adjourned at 2:40pm.

### **ACCESS CODES AND PASSWORDS FOR FILING MMR'S ON LINE**

**These are the instructions from International**

Member numbers and passwords are new and can be found as follows:

- Password for club officers can be found on the monthly club statement both above the Lions emblem and along the bottom of the statement with the wording "PASSWORD FOR THE WMMR SITE ONLY" and the Lions emblem to the right of it.
- Member numbers can be found on the per capita invoices received by clubs in January. The member number is now 6 or 7 digits long. **The member number is entered in the Member Number Box.**

#### **MMR REPORTS**

The procedure for sending MMR's to district officers will be the responsibility of the club. Clubs can e-mail their MMR or print and fax or mail it to the district officers. If using the new WMMR site, it will not be necessary to send headquarters a copy as all the required information will be captured at the time of entry.

#### **INSTRUCTIONS USING THE OLD MEMBERSHIP SITE**

If you plan to continue using this site, the **six-digit club number** must be entered, which can be found on your club statement. Be sure to enter the leading zero(s) to ensure the number is 6 digits in length. The password will be the same as what you have already been using. **DO NOT enter the password that appears on the club statement.** If you need the password for the old site, please send an e-mail to [passwords@lionsclubs.org](mailto:passwords@lionsclubs.org)  
**DO NOT ENTER THE INFORMATION ON BOTH SITES.**

## Indiana's Alternative Communication Program

A Partnership Between the Indiana Lions Speech & Hearing Project,  
The Indiana University School of Medicine and Riley Hospital for Children

Indiana's Alternative Communication Program (IACP) is designed to provide Indiana residents, who are unable to communicate through spoken voice, access to alternative communication devices that facilitate effective communication. A host of medical

Conditions such as autism, Down syndrome, multiple sclerosis, Lou Gehrig's disease (ALS), cerebral palsy, head and neck cancer and stroke as well as many other lesser-known conditions may impair communication.

Each year, thousands are treated for their communication deficits at Indiana University and Riley hospitals. Those with the most severe communication deficits are referred for evaluation of Augmentative-Alternative Communication systems (AAC)-electronic communication devices. AAC systems are expensive and require time to evaluate the effectiveness of the devices for each individual. With a \$112,000 grant from LCIF and Indiana Lions Speech & Hearing, Inc., Indiana's Alternative Communication Program has been established. The program maintains a large and diverse inventory of AAC devices along with a dedicated staff of speech pathologists.

Indiana's Alternative Communication Program now is able to provide access to an extensive loan library for any person who needs AAC. With the establishment of the IACP, individuals have immediate access to the AAC devices they need. Moreover, the program allows individuals to "check out" the devices and try them at home, at work or at school for a three-month period. At the end of the loan period, a decision is made between beginning the process to purchase the recommended device *pr* to continue to evaluate other devices. When a device has proven successful, Medicare, Medicaid, and/or private insurers may become involved for the purchase .of the communication system.
